Fall semester

Course : French as a Foreign Language (FFL) – general French

Level: A1.1 (Complete beginner)

Learning objective:

The course aims at gaining basic knowledge in French language and working your way towards the **A1** level of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages ([CEFR](#)). The A1 level is usually reached after completing two terms – A1.1 and A1.2 – of 36 hours each.

CEFR A0 level of at the beginning of the course: *no knowledge of French language.*

General descriptor of the CEFR A1 target level [upon completion of two semesters]:

"The learner can understand and use familiar daily expressions and very basic phrases whose goal is to satisfy all practical needs. They can introduce themselves and others and can ask and answer questions about personal details such as where they live, people they know and things they have. They can interact in a simple way provided the other person talks slowly and clearly and is prepared to help."

Assessment: Full continuous assessment, composed of two parts:

1/ Ongoing assessment throughout the term (60% of the final grade)

Continuous assessment will take into account grades received both in class (30% of the final grade) and online (30% of the final grade). Please refer to the schedule of main assignments on pages 4-5.

2/ Final exam (40% of the finale grade)

The final exam will be a written test. It will assess the acquisition of the target language level at the end of the course in at least three different language skills.

Please note that no official examination notices are sent.

Upon completion of the course, students will obtain **a certificate of achievement**, which will state their level of French and their final grade, along with the ECTS credits that will be received – if applicable.

Attendance policy:

Under the full continuous assessment system, and in compliance with the *Modalités de Contrôle des Connaissances* specific to FLE and FLS courses at Université Gustave Eiffel, attendance to every class is mandatory. In case of any unjustified absence, you will not be able to validate the course and no credits will be awarded. In case of an absence, notify the administrative staff at fle.international@univ-eiffel.fr within 48 hours. Failure to do so will result in an unjustified absence ("ABI").

The only documents accepted in case of absences are medical notes or official convocations notices. For any other case, the Academic Coordinator for French as a Foreign Language Programs will decide whether or not a given reason is an acceptable justification for absence. Foreseeable absences must be notified in advance.
